Tasks:

- Construction of structural 2D and 3D models along a cross-section through the Alps, based on geological information that was collected during the building of the Brenner basis tunnel (BBT)
- Linking microstructural information that was calculated by our project partners into the structural models
- Retro-deformation of the constructed models to quantify the deformation in the Alps and deduce the tectonic processes in the study area
- Field data collection (high alpine region)
- Presentation of results at project meetings as well as national and international conferences
- Writing of publications for scientific journals in English

Required profile:

- MSc or equivalent in geosciences, geophysics or comparable subjects.
- Knowledge of tectonics and structural geology
- Basic knowledge of the geology of the Alps
- Knowledge of the software packages: 2D/3Dmove, GoCAD or Petrel
- Ability to work in an interdisciplinary team
- Independent and structured way of working, resilience
- Good written and spoken English ability (level C1)
- The ability to carry out fieldwork in high Alpine areas.
